

On motion of Councilman Sciliano, seconded by Councilman Dionisio, the public hearing was opened,

Seth Mendelbaum representing the law firm McCullough, Goldberger & Staudt addressed the Board on behalf of the Harrison Real Estate Group LLC. He is seeking a Special Exception Use Permit for a proposed mix use building at 241-247 Halstead Avenue. The current condition of the property is retail in the front, which is zoned "CBD", and the rear of the property is a "B" zone and backs up to Fremont Street where there is an existing parking lot. The proposal is a five-story mixed use building with retail and some residential on the first floor and then additional residential units above for a total of 19 residential units with 19 parking spaces in the back in the location of the existing parking lot. This is a transited oriented development, right across from the train station. This project has been reviewed extensively by both the Zoning Board and the Planning Board.



Supervisor Belmont asked for the breakdown of one and two bedroom apartments.

David Gross, Architect, replied he believed there are 15, two bedrooms and 4, one bedroom apartments. The two bedrooms are 1,100 square feet and the one bedrooms are 700 square feet.

Harrison resident Emil Toso said he lived right alongside the project. The parking lot of this project is on a two-family lot. It is surrounded by two family houses. The neighborhood is a two-family neighborhood. The unlawful parking lot has existed for 50 years. As neighbors, we have complained about it and the town has always turned a deaf ear. He realized that the town's reasoning for doing it was for the benefit of the business district that far outweighed the inconvenience to the neighborhood. Mr. Toso stated that this property is looking for a special exception tonight and is owned by two of the Zoning Board members along with various other parties. There is a requirement for parking. It is 1 ¼ vehicle per apartment. This applicant has 15 two bedroom apartments. Mr. Toso wasn't sure if one space per apartment is going to be enough; it is going to spill out onto Fremont Street where we already have a problem with parking in the "B" zone. This project has applied to the Zoning and Planning Boards for variances as though it was now an approved "B" zone lot. It hasn't been approved. The findings of these Boards show that the lot hasn't been rezoned. They are asking you tonight to give them a special exception for an apartment house and by doing it you are also granting them special exception to the parking. Mr. Toso asked the Board to develop this with consideration to the quality of the neighborhood as well as the business they are trying to establish on Halstead Avenue.

Seth Mendelbaum representing the law firm McCullough, Goldberger & Staudt said with respect to the two zones Mr. Toso was discussing, 235-7J of the Zoning Ordinance gives the Zoning Board the authority to allow zoning be pulled through, in this case, from CBD to the "B" zone and they granted that variance among all the variances they granted and noted.

Supervisor Belmont asked Mr. Mendelbaum when did this process start; when did you first go to the Planning Board?

Seth Mendelbaum representing the law firm McCullough, Goldberger & Staudt replied that it has been a couple of years.

Councilman Malfitano asked Mr. Mendelbaum if one of the variances granted was a parking variance.

Seth Mendelbaum from the law firm McCullough, Goldberger & Staudt replied in the affirmative.

Councilman Malfitano said he believed in the Transit Oriented Development (TOD's) Proposal and Agreement that the Board along with Metro North took it to a one vehicle per unit parking ratio.

Seth Mendelbaum representing the law firm McCullough, Goldberger & Staudt replied that the underlying zoning is 1.25; 1.0 is pretty well accepted for TOD's because of the proximity to mass transit.

Councilman Malfitano questioned the materials on the exterior of the building. He noted the brick but was interested in what made up the rest of the building.

David Gross, Architect, replied there was a blank metal railing, stone sills, and full brick, and the side of the building was not vinyl siding.

Councilman Sciliano opined that architecture in the front was an upgrade to what is on the existing buildings, the rear of the building has been treated well with the brick wall and the plantings and it eliminates the eye sore that is there now. Overall, he thought it to be a benefit to the local community and the Town.

Councilman Malfitano said he was going to vote for it but without prejudice of what may come in the future.

Councilwoman Amelio explained she would also vote in favor of it but said Mr. Toso's concerns about parking are well thought out. Parking is a big issue in general in Harrison.



David Steinmetz representing the law firm Zarin and Steinmetz spoke on behalf of the Shelter Group doing business as Brightview Senior Living regarding the property at 600 Lake Street. The order of business was to seek confirmation of the Planning Board's Special Use Permit under Town Code Section 235-14H. On December 20, 2016, the Planning Board adopted three resolutions: Steep Slope Permit, Site Plan Approval and Special Exception Use. 

Harrison resident Robert Porto spoke on being opposed to this project due to the location and that the change in zoning affects Harrison in a negative way.

Harrison resident Steve Surace submitted literature and a letter for the record. He suggested that the fire access plan does not meet the Fire Code of New York State. He believed the building as designed is too large. Mr. Surace was concerned with a wood frame building. He suggested that the town hire a third party certified in the New York State Code to do a review.

Harrison resident Joe Surace feels the building is too large and does not like materials being used like the vinyl siding because it burns.

Harrison resident Glenn Daher submitted a letter dated February 15, 2017 for the record. He also requested a new balloon test be done again for one to two weeks.

Harrison resident Sarah Lisk is opposed to the project and suggested the Board be more respectful to the residents.

Harrison resident Lori Lisk is opposed to the project and had the impression that 160 units is too much. She is concerned about safety with increased traffic and believed the traffic study that was performed was not adequate.

Harrison resident Michael Daher is opposed to the project and was concerned that the Planning Board abused their discretion and that nursing homes can't be built on property less then 10 acres.

Harrison resident Mike Levesque is opposed to the project and discussed the decibel levels and his concerns about the noise. He was also concerned with the negative impact the project would have on the character of the neighborhood.

Harrison resident Sam Hosington is opposed to the project and believes the building is too massive for the community and suggested the Planning Board did not do a thorough job. He was certain a Full Environmental Impact Statement should have been done. He asked the Board what would happen if the facility goes under or it is repurposed.

Harrison resident Sam Fanelli asked if the Board voted for approval and set a precedent, would he be allowed to build four stories on his property in the business district.

Harrison resident Vanessa Daher is opposed to the project and vehemently believes the project is too big and doesn't fit the character of the neighborhood. She feels the community is not being heard.

2017 - - 060 (continued)

Harrison resident Joseph Russo is opposed to the project and believes that a 160-unit structure will decease property values in the neighborhood. He also said that traffic will increase on Lake Street. Mr. Russo exclaimed the Board works for the residents not the Corporation.

Harrison resident Jennifer Spana said she is opposed to the project at this location.

Harrison resident Catherine Yanell is opposed to the project and was concerned that since the Town Board approved the Zoning Text Amendment the Planning Board stated that their hands were tied. She is concerned with the traffic on Lake Street.

Harrison resident Jorge Golowasch suggested that the setback and slope needs to be reworked. He also questioned how many units are available in Brightview's other properties.

David Steinmetz from the law firm Zarin and Steinmetz responded to questions and concerns he heard about fire protection, Stipulation Agreement, zoning, volume, Full Environmental Impact Statement, SEQRA, traffic and construction materials.

Harrison resident Glenn Daher questioned the need for a Brightview facility at this location and the need as to whether it could be filled with other senior living facilities planned in area.

Harrison resident Steve Surace questioned the fire lane around the building and access roadways as per the Fire Code of the State of New York. He thinks the Board should go to an independent third party for answers.

Town Attorney Frank Allegretti said just to clarify what Mr. Surace was saying about the Fire Code it has numerous exceptions.

David Steinmetz from the law firm Zarin and Steinmetz said the applicant stipulates that any confirmation issued by this Board should mandate that this building comply with all applicable New York State Building and Fire Codes.

After asking if there were any more questions Supervisor Belmont announced that the Board was going to keep the Public Hearing open. We are going to get some answers and then we will continue the Public Hearing and take a vote.

Councilman Malfitano moved to continue the Public Hearing at the next regularly scheduled Town Board meeting to be held on March 2, 2017.

Councilman Dionisio seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

Harrison resident Matt Benson replied that we have heard about a lot of deficiencies in the laws tonight. It is relevant that the Board has made a priority at acting on this.

Harrison resident Shauna Long asked if the public would have an opportunity to review the ordinance and amended changes.

Councilman Malfitano replied by explaining that if we assume that we come to some point and we have language that we are all in somewhat agreement on, it would be brought into the public record in the hearing and that would become part of the record.

Harrison resident Shauna Long said she would ask that they have an opportunity, because if you present it and decide at the same meeting, then it is difficult for the public to make good comments.
