



CONTINUATION OF PUBLIC HEARING RE: ENACTING CHAPTER 193,  
ENTITLED "RESIDENTIAL PARKING SYSTEM IN THE TOWN OF HARRISON"

On motion of Councilman Malfitano, seconded by Councilman Sciliano, the Public Hearing was opened.

Town Attorney Allegretti briefed the Board on minor changes made to the draft law. The amendments to the proposed law read as follows: Struck out the language in 193-3-A that read "Fix and require the payment of fees." Amended to read "At no cost to the residents." Added 193-3-H which reads "Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, all prohibitions on parking in excess of twenty-four (24) hours shall remain in effect for all vehicles within the permit area." He suggested that if residents had comments that haven't been made at previous meetings the Board could open the floor to any further and additional comments.


Harrison resident Robert Porto spoke about the two and four hour parking signs not being included in the proposed law. He suggested that the Board didn't understand the proposed law.

Town Attorney Allegretti said these limitations, depending on the street you live on, will still remain in effect if you do not have a resident parking permit.

Councilman Malfitano responded to Mr. Porto by stating the entirety of the Board and Counsel had a very precise understanding of the law but unfortunately he didn't. If you would like to listen, we are happy to help you. If, however you are not going to listen, I think we need to move on. This law has a certain intention to exempt everyone who lives in the district from the parking laws. It is to their benefit. If they chose not to take the sticker they would be subject to the laws that are on the books that exist today.

Harrison resident Robert Porto said this is going to be up for review after a certain time but it does not specify it. He expressed for the record that you shouldn't have to register per person and show residency when people are paying taxes. He stated that the law stinks.

Supervisor Belmont said you do not have to show residency per person it is per vehicle.

Harrison resident Robert Porto said people are going to park right outside the zone. What is there to protect us from people parking outside our houses now? I'm telling you people are going to park right outside the zone. What are you going to do about that?

Councilwoman Amelio said we will certainly address that if that happens. Why would you think this is something we are doing to penalize residents? It is something we are trying to do to help residents. What would you like us to do when cars are parking all day long in front of resident's homes?

Harrison resident Jeff Hodges was seeking clarification on the 24 hour parking law. He heard someone mention that if you had a permit you could park for over 24 hours. People go on vacation and you have to plan for that. They should be allowed to park in front of their own residence.

Town Attorney Allegretti said right now there is a Village Ordinance in place that prohibits any vehicle from parking more than 24 hours continually on a town/village street.

Deputy Village Attorney Cipolla said if there is an issue like that you can contact the police department and advise them that you are going away for a few days. If we don't have the language contained in the proposed legislation regarding the 24 hours, essentially anybody with the permit can put their car in front of their house and not move it for a year and there is nothing that can be done. This is why it is necessary to have that language in the law.

Councilman Sciliano said the police are not out looking for 24 hour violations. Most of the time the 24 hour violations are called in by someone in the neighborhood.

Harrison resident Jeff Hodges asked the Board if the law was going to be enforced before residents have the opportunity to get a permit.

Councilman Cannella responded to Mr. Hodges by saying no. It's going to be a slow education period and we will see how it goes and it will be reviewed in 90 days and 180 days and if there are bumps in it we will fix it.

Harrison resident Karen Moro asked if the Board decided how they will handle visitors and workers at the resident's homes who live in the district. Was anything added to the law with regard to this this?

Supervisor Belmont said someone working on your house who is licensed and has that on his truck should not be a problem. Any other circumstances that go on we ask you to notify the police department.

Harrison resident Karen Moro said she is uncomfortable with this and was upset that the onus is now on her to call the police department.

Councilwoman Amelio said let's eliminate the person working on your house. If you have someone who is commercially licensed generally their trucks says who they are and they will not be ticketed.

Harrison resident Karen Moro asked if that was in the law.

Town Attorney Allegretti said it is not in the law now and those tickets are not being issued at random like you are suggesting they are. This is not selective enforcement; it is called reasonable assessment.

Harrison resident Karen Moro said residents not watching this meeting will not know about this. The information must be provided to the residents.

Councilwoman Amelio said the information will be out there. The Mayor puts out a newsletter every week.

Harrison resident Karen Moro asked why is it so difficult to give us something that we can hang on our rearview mirrors that says "VISITOR".

Councilwoman Amelio said you need to notify the police department.

Harrison resident Dave Tolve told the Board that he thought things were being over thought here. The alternative to what they are suggesting is leave the signs up, no one gets a permit, and everyone gets ticketed. This is the way it is in White Plains, Rye, Mamaroneck and Larchmont; you either move your car or get ticketed. I think what you are trying to do here is great to help the residents.

Harrison resident Bill McKay thanked the Board for striking the language about the fee. He asked the Board how it would be handled when people had a company car. He suggested that some people would push the envelope with the permits. What is the Board going to do about verifying this?

Town Attorney Allegretti said his office will be working in conjunction with the Clerk's office as situations evolve with the application process. The Clerk along with our office will develop procedures to make sure that it's legitimate and within the bounds of the proposed law.

Councilman Cannella said what the Board has decided to do for the moment is roll it out and deal with it on a case by case basis and there will be protocols that will be created as we go through with this. This is the only way to do this.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said they put up more signs on Harrison Avenue. Previously you stated nothing would change but now there are signs up.

Councilwoman Amelio said perhaps the signs were not there before but as the Attorney's have said the parking regulations have existed perhaps there wasn't a sign indicating it but nothing was changed.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said she was concerned about workers or visitors at her house. She would like each resident to get a tag that could be hung in a car stating they are guests of a resident. This also seems to me like it is going to be a lot of work and more labor intensive and it seems to me you are going to need more bodies to make this work.

Supervisor Belmont said you would have to come in and show us your registration initially but then after that we could do this automatically.

Councilman Malfitano said the process is really very simple. We are doing it now and have been for many years with the commuter parking. You demonstrate residency and are issued a permit and then every year you are mailed a new application. The onus is not on Clerk's office to determine your residency.

Town Clerk Jackie Greer said her office could handle the task.

Harrison resident Bill McKay asked the Board what happens next.

Town Attorney Allegretti said the amendments are before the Board and at the conclusion of the Public Hearing a Board member can make a motion and it could be seconded and action could be taken.

Harrison resident Dave Tolve said he thinks a sticker that has the car license plate number on it is the way to go. I think it needs to be affixed to the vehicle so they don't get abused.

Harrison resident Angela Badolato was concerned that the Board would pass the legislation without addressing the concerns about guests/visitors.

Councilman Sciliano made a motion to close the Public Hearing and Councilwoman Amelio seconded the motion.

Councilman Malfitano said he would like to reserve voting on this.

Councilman Cannella said concurred.

Councilwoman Amelio concurred.

Councilman Cannella said the reality is that it is very difficult come up with one or two sentences that say, and are distinct and clear enough, that they would actually be of value.

Councilman Malfitano said some residents presented the Board with an impossibility. If the Board were to enact this, there are provisions that some of you want that we cannot legally adopt. If we don't enact the provisions of the law that currently exists there are going to be things that you are going to have to live with and you are not going to be happy with. You presented us with an impossible set of circumstances. I know what I want to do because I think this law is in everyone's best interest but given what I'm hearing from this group and what some people seem to think should be built into this law, frankly the Board can't as a matter of law build in some of your requests. We cannot give you everything you want because it contradicts and it goes to the point of selective enforcement.

Councilwoman Amelio said the important point is that you presented some question for us and we do hear you. This wasn't meant to penalize the residents.

Councilman Malfitano explained his intention to reserve voting on this tonight and if we could table this to the next meeting that would be fine.

Councilwoman Amelio said I understand you want something that you could hang from the rearview mirror but we've heard stories of people that sell them to others and make money from it so someone who is a commuter can park there. There are all sorts of issues.

Councilman Malfitano said we have a parking problem. We have people coming from out of town and parking on our streets at will. The only way to resolve that is to enforce our laws. If we enforce our laws as they are currently written I guarantee everyone who is in

this room and everyone who is in this district is going to be unhappy because suddenly they are going to be issued tickets, their family members are going to be issued tickets, people who work in their homes are going to be issued tickets. That's the reality and that is the way it is in every other jurisdiction around us. So now we have a problem and we have to fix it. What do we try to do? We try to give everyone who lives in the district the opportunity to be exempt from the law. Then everyone comes in here and says that's great, but we want you to exempt everybody else who we choose to indentify. We can't have it both ways. It's just not possible. We have two choices: We can pass this law the way it is or we can "can" it. Those are the two choices. After listening to the back and forth here tonight I'm starting to think we ought to throw this out and let our police department enforce the laws that we have.

Harrison resident Karen Moro said she wanted the Board to know that I am not against the permit. You keep implying that I don't appreciate what you are trying to do. Do what you have to do and we will deal with the problems as they come along.

Councilman Cannella said he would like to insert a sentence that says temporary permits of not greater than three days can be issued by the Town Clerk for special circumstances.

Councilman Malfitano said we can not do that.

Councilman Sciliano said either we pass it or forget it. I'm going to make a motion that we enact this.

Councilman Malfitano suggested that we table the vote on this until after we've had the opportunity to discuss it amongst ourselves one more time. If you want to vote on this now he would not support it.

Councilman Cannella said he would not vote against it but he would abstain. I'm just not ready to do it now.

Councilwoman Amelio said we are not going to make everyone happy with this. It is an impossible task.

Supervisor Belmont said we will vote on this on March 19, 2015.

He suggested that the grass is going to be thrown in with the garbage and that is going to cost the town a lot of money.

Supervisor Belmont suggested residents put the proper blades on their lawn mowers so they will mulch the grass or create a compost pile.

Harrison resident Robert Porto said the DEC doesn't want us to put our grass clippings at the Department of Transportation (DOT) building because it is close to the Kensico Reservoir. Is \$10,000 enough to not pollute the water?

Town Engineer Mike Amodeo said he believed the \$10,000 Mr. Porto is referring to is the proposal for consultant fees for the design. The Department of Environmental Protection (DOT) is having the Town remove the grass clippings from the DOT site and that is to protect the watershed. On top of that we are required to make some storm water provisions to the site. The \$10,000 is for the design of that.
