Harrison resident Mike LaDore said to the Board that rumor has it that Harrison has signed a contract with Verizon regarding FIOS. Is there any truth to that?

Supervisor Belmont said that is a rumor and he really could not comment on it.

Harrison resident Raya Munzer said she received the Mayor's letter regarding security in the schools and wanted to know moving forward what the town's plans are. I'm here tonight to get as much information as possible. As far as I remember we were told that the police officers would be at the schools through June and since that is changing I would like some more information.

Supervisor Belmont said that after he spoke to Ms. Munzer on the phone he went through the minutes of the board meeting in question and it was never stated by the Board that the police officers would be there throughout the year. As the Mayor understood it, Chief Marraccini was asked by the audience if the police would remain in the schools throughout the year. The Chief responded with issues of why they could or could not be there. The Chief was not sure if they could be there throughout the year.

Harrison resident Raya Munzer said it may have been a little convoluted of a meeting with all the questions that the parents were asking. Many of us do remember that we were told that the police officers would be there until June until the long term procedures were figured out. I would like to know if the long term procedures have been figured out and is that why we are pulling the officers?

Police Chief Anthony Marraccini addressed Ms. Munzer's inquiry by explaining that we have given the school security quite a bit of thought. It is something that is very important obviously to the Board and the Police Department. The police department is challenged by many different needs throughout the community. We are seeing, unfortunately, some increases in crime in some areas, some domestic violence, some specialized cases that have taken our attention and he is currently looking at the day to day operations of the police department in comparison to the school security issue. I will tell you that I had more officers assigned to school security then I did patrolling the streets of the town. At times I would have one or none patrolling the streets of the town but I would have six police officers in the schools. That is problematic for us. Obviously it comes down to staffing and long range planning but it also comes down to the school and building fortification. My position on it is yes a police officer would make people feel good and would potentially aid in these types of very extreme situations. There has to be a long term comprehensive plan that would involve much more staffing for the police department but I believe it starts with building fortification. I think that's where the first line of defense starts. We have met with the school officials and looked at their security issues and addressed some things with them. They are acting on some of those things. They have had private security companies come in and evaluated the schools to see how they could fortify those buildings. There are plans that are in effect. The day to day needs of the town for policing unfortunately are overwhelming. We come up with a comprehensive plan to try and help those daily needs and to keep our school security in check. We currently assigned 2 Student Resource Officers (SRO) one to the middle school and one to the high school. The SRO's primary role is not school security but instead to interact with the students. It is to try

to build relationships to help kids. That is a key component for security for our children and security for our schools. This is one of the first steps that we made that is going to be a positive effect. We haven't totally withdrawn security from our elementary schools; we have cut back because we need to have more police officers available for us on the road. In addition I have to be budget conscious with regard to our overtime. We still have officers patrolling our elementary schools. I have one officer that is checking Preston and Purchase schools regularly throughout the day and one officer that is checking on Harrison Avenue and Parsons regularly throughout the day. We are looking down the road and obviously if the town believes that we should have officers in every school the police department will do what we can to provide that service.

Supervisor Belmont said that this was not made public for obvious reasons but a letter went to every parent. This was not in my weekly column nor was it a blast email. We have gone, above and beyond any other community in Westchester County. Here is a run down: Scarsdale has visits only, they didn't want a police presence in their schools; Bronxville has visits but no presence; Blind Brook is in the schools but are being paid for by the school district; Rye hired an outside private firm to do their security in the schools; Mamaroneck is attempting to have a greater police presence; Eastchester initially was there for pick up and drop off. Now they go in occasionally throughout the day; Pelham is trying to increase police presence but do not want a daily presence; Port Chester was there the first day with a car that drove throughout the school property; Ardsley stayed with there SRO officer at the middle and high schools and had a police presence the first few days. We went above and beyond any other community in Westchester. I think the chief and the board should be commended for that. We did not make this public; we just wanted the parents to know but not the general public. So this is our plan for now and we are going to stay with it for a while.
