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Application instructions and requirements

- 1. Equipment listing, and manufacturer specifications including UL listing or NTRL listing for all equipment being installed must be provided;
- 2. Floor plan of building showing location of equipment being installed, distributed or stored;
- 3. Piping design plan indication routing of pipe and method of labeling piping as per ANST A13.1;
- 4. Construction drawings indicating the entire work proposed, including location of all Carbon Dioxide Sensors with linked alarms and visual signaling devices;
- 5. All storage, use and handling of Carbon Dioxide shall be in accordance with Chapter 53 of the 2020 Fire Code of New York State and Chapter 13 of NFPA 55;
- 6. Method of securing cylinders from unauthorized access or accidental dislodgements must be provided;
- 7. Location of warning signage, required per NFPA 704, and additional hazard warning signage specific to the material is required.
