

BRENTWOOD BROOK FLOODPLAIN RESTORATION PROJECT GREEN INOVATION GRANT PROGRAM DESIGNATION OF INTENT TO SERVE AS SEQR LEAD AGENCY

WHEREAS, the Town of Harrison has received \$2,600,000 in New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, Green Innovation Grant Program (GIGP) funding to undertake the Brentwood Brook Floodplain Restoration Project; and

WHEREAS, the proposed action involves lowering the surface elevation of lands surrounding the Brentwood Brook within Veterans Park owned by the Town, and within adjacent lands owned by the Harrison Central School District. Lowering the surface elevation of these lands by several feet will increase the flood storage capability of the Brook's floodplain; and

WHEREAS, once the new elevation is established, the area will be restored to its current natural parkland use, and will drain freely into the Brook, without the need to construct any structures, pipes or basins; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 6NYCRR Part 617.6 (a) (1) (iv.), the proposed action as described above is classified as an Unlisted Action; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of 6NYCRR Part 617.6, the Town Board of the Town of Harrison intends to serve as Lead Agency for the SEQRA Review of this Unlisted Action, and in this capacity, will determine if the proposed action will have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 617.6 (b) (2) a Coordinated Review of this action will be conducted.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Harrison hereby designates its intention to serve as Lead Agency for the SEQRA Coordinated Review of this Unlisted Action, and directs the circulation this Lead Agency Notice, along with the Environmental Assessment Form and associated documentation, to all Involved Agencies. Involved Agencies shall be given 30 days from the mailing of the Lead Agency Notice to challenge the Town Board's designation.
