Re: Request for approval to spray washable chalk slogans on sidewalks around the Town to promote love of reading, literacy and Library services.

Purpose – To build awareness of Library services, promote literacy and the summer reading challenge.

Time – Friday, June 1st and Saturday, June 2nd.

Space – The chalking will be done on the most popular downtown sidewalks.

Artwork – Twelve slogans and a Library logo picture were selected for the project. Professional stencils will be used for this project.

Paint – Washable Montana Chalk Spray will be used. The paint will be applied in a quality manner. Spills and paint drips will be cleaned up. All materials and equipment will be removed from sidewalks after installation is complete. The paint will remain on sidewalks until it washes off with a rain or wears off with the traffic.

Safety – The Police Department will be notified. The volunteers will be working on sites during low traffic activity 10 AM to 3 PM. Teen volunteers will be supervised. The business owners will be notified before sidewalks painting begins.
