





The Planning Board also granted a Special Exception Use Permit for multi-family residential use as well as retail through this mixed-use project. The Town Code required that they ask this Board for Final Special Exception Use Permit approval. Mr. Mandelbaum requested that after the presentation and after answering questions he requested that the Town Board consider closing the hearing and granting the permit.






EXISTING 3 WESTCHESTER PARK DRIVE BUILDING



Councilman Malfitano asked Mr. Mandelbaum to discuss the form of the easement and public right-of-way.

Mr. Mandelbaum replied that they worked quite extensively on this with the Planning Board to come up with connectivity between this project and the Toll Brother's project. Marcus Partners along with Toll Brothers would grant a public easement from each property to the town for the benefit of the public.

Councilman Sciliano opined that the affordable housing component seemed a little light.

Mr. Mandelbaum replied that affordable housing is something that was worked on at length with the Planning Board. He believed this to be the last of the big projects and this would get the Town up to 72 affordable housing units.

Mr. Andy Tung from Divney, Tung, Schwalbe Project Planners replied that there are 23 units of affordable housing which is 5%. This is a bit of a balance between making the economics of the project work while providing a social benefit.

Councilman Sciliano commented that he has been receiving comments from residents that there are a lot of local tradesmen in town and he asked that there be a commitment that the project seek bids from local contractors.

Mr. Mandelbaum replied that the IDA approval requires a good faith effort in our hiring local subs and labor unions as well.

Councilman Dionisio asked Mr. Mandelbaum what the number of the one, two- and three-bedrooms units.

Mr. Tung replied that just under 10% of the units will be studios units, which amounts to about 35 of units. One third will be one-bedroom units, which amounts to about 150 units. Fifty percent will be two bedrooms units which amounts to about 250 units. About 2% of the units will be three-bedroom units.

Councilman Gordon commented that he saw in the Final Environmental Impact Statement that Mr. Mandelbaum had incorporated by reference, the Draft Environmental Impact Statement. Councilman Gordon requested a hard copy so he could delve into the details behind some of the figures. Councilman Gordon explained that one of the issues that has come up while speaking with residents is their concernes with the number of students this will add to the schools He noted an estimate of 28 to 32 students and that is in accordance with the study that was commissioned. An issue that concerned Councilman Gordon was if back testing took place. The developer has 15 existing projects. Councilman Gordon asked if it would be possible to get student population from those 15 projects for actual data to compare to what the study says.

Councilman Gordon was interested in the Final Impact Statement. It examines open space and recreation and it took all the current residential projects in town and combined the impacts of those in analyzing the required amount of open space. He asked that the developer do the same with respect to students; combine all the pending residential developments in Harrison and note in total this is going to add whatever number to the school.

Mr. Frank Phish from McCullough, Goldberger & Staudt replied that he had a fairly good confidence level in the data. The mix is heavy on the one- and two-bedroom units. The 11 three-bedroom units are what have the potential for public school children. We have done surveys in this area and we have all of Avalon's developments data. This is where we got our number of 32 students. Mr. Phish didn't think this will in any way overwhelm the school district.

Councilman Gordon replied at the Planning Board level all of the projects are looked at in isolation. He would like to see a combined analysis.

Councilman Malfitano had a question on the property itself. He noted the property is 11.5 acres and the plan is to sub-divide that. Has the sub-division taken place?

Mr. Mandelbaum replied not yet. It is part of the Planning Board package of approvals. The purpose of the sub-division is for financing.

Councilman Malfitano raised a concern that it is significant in terms of number of units and he gathered that the developer didn't plan on building both at the same time, is that correct?

Mr. Tung replied that they are planning on building both of these. The current schedule has about a six-month gap between both.

Councilman Malfitano asked for them to describe the target market and a range of price points.

Mr. Tung replied that it is younger working professionals and empty nesters. The way we designed the units and the amenity packages within them are friendly to the demographics of people that would want to live there. Overall average rent we believe will be in the high \$2,000 range.

Councilman Gordon questioned if the sewer system video results that have been discussed in the Impact Statement come back yet and are there any issues with that?

Mr. Tung replied that the video results came back from the sewer undertaking. In fact, the only break found in the line occurs right on Westchester Park Drive just in front of the site. It is a break on top of the line so it isn't affecting the flow and is something that would be repaired as part of the construction.

Councilman Gordon questioned the proposed access easement and the connector roadway asking if they are the same. Councilman Gordon was sure it was studied but it seemed to him that the main roadway would be very busy. Are you comfortable with the level of traffic?

Mr. Mandelbaum replied that a full traffic study has been completed and is part of the record with the Planning Board.

Supervisor Belmont requested a motion to close the public hearing.

Councilman Gordon said he would like to continue this until January. He knew the developer still had issues in front of the Planning Board and can't move forward anyway. Councilman Gordon wanted to get the documents he had asked for.

Mr. Mandelbaum said this project has been pending for 13 months and went through the full Environmental Impact Review process. It has gone through a total of ten different public meetings and the projects whole team is here tonight if there are any additional questions. We would ask the Board to close the hearing and grant us the approval this evening.
