WHEREAS, the proposed law would prohibit a municipality's ability to craft specific regulations while considering the impacts on the locality's environment, infrastructure, parking, school enrollment, as well as emergency services coverage within its borders; and

WHEREAS, in not considering the impacts specific to a local municipality, this legislation will have far reaching effects impacting the health, safety and quality of life of the residents of the Town of Harrison; and

WHEREAS, a one size fits all requirement encroaches on the ability of every New Yorker to participate in local planning and zoning in the community in which they live; and

WHEREAS, these additional contemplated illegal dwelling units do not comport with local Zoning Laws, nor the New York State Building and Fire Codes, and create hazardous and dangerous conditions; and

WHEREAS, the proposed legislation causes additional concerns regarding the conversion of hotel and office space to residential use as of right without any local oversight; and
