



He has no current building permit. They're all expired. I'll go through them real quick.

So he's had different machinations and iterations of a project at the site since 2008. In 2008, he got planning board approval for site plan for a retail-only use. That site plan -- they're only valid for a year once the planning board grants it. So that expired on January 22 of 2009.

His next plan was submitted in 2009 and approved in 2010. That was for retail and ten apartments with parking underground. So he got site plan approval for that. He got zoning board approval. Those approvals expired on March 23rd, 2011, for his site plan, and his zoning expired on February 10th, 2011.

In 2014, he went back to the planning board for another site plan for retail only.

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That was -- and he also went for zoning approval. That site plan was approved. The -- and it expired. Construction did not commence by June 12th, 2015. So once -- once that happens, according to the terms of the site plan, it expires on its own terms.

His next plan was submitted in 2015 for retail and two apartments. That was a site plan approval, which was granted by the planning board. That expired on April 28th of 2016, and that was the application upon which a building permit was issued. And that building permit was issued on March 7th, 2017, for retail, two apartments, and that permit expired on September 7th, 2017, because no work had commenced, and the applicant received notice of the fact that his building permit was expired on September 19th, 2017.

He then filed for another site plan in 2016 for retail and three apartments, which was also approved, and that site plan expired on its own terms on May 24th, 2017. So currently, he has no site-plan approvals. Zoning variance approvals are no longer valid, and he's got no building permit.
