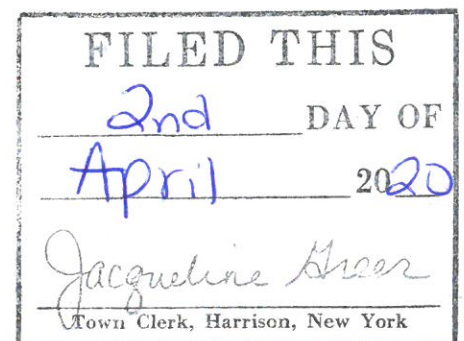

Trustee Leader said she would like to table this until the next board meeting. She hadn't had a chance to go look at the streets also so the Board should make sure that members of the community, who may live on those streets, have an opportunity to speak up at the next board meeting. Councilwoman Leader is supportive of the concept because safety should always come first. Councilwoman Leader explained that she hadn't had the opportunity to go over there and see what is being requested.

Police Chief Vasta explained that earlier in the year he was approached by several residents and complaints were submitted to Mayor Belmont's office. During a meeting with the Mayor, he asked me to investigate the feasibility of implementing what has been suggested. Chief Vasta as well as a member of the department went out and canvased the streets in question and came back to the Mayor with the conclusion that it was certainly feasible.

Trustee Leader asked the Chief what the residents had raised with him?

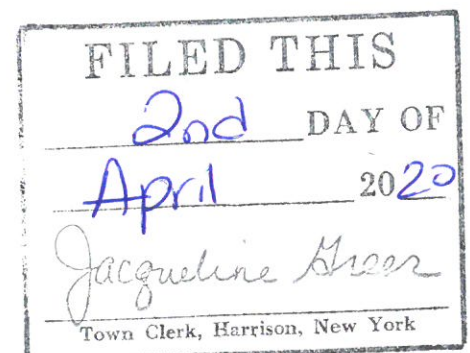
Police Chief Vasta said the feedback from the residents was, from their observations, increased traffic in the area with delivery vehicles parked in the roadway, tag sales, and it has become problematic with people having to go around these vehicles. With this being said the Chief proposed this to the Board.

Trustee Dionisio asked Chief Vasta if this would make a safer situation for the roadway.

Police Chief Vasta said it would.

Trustee Leader asked the other Board members if they would mind waiting until the next meeting to vote on this so she could visit and observe and evaluate the area of concern.

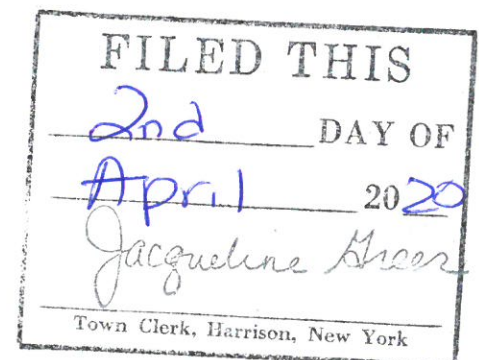

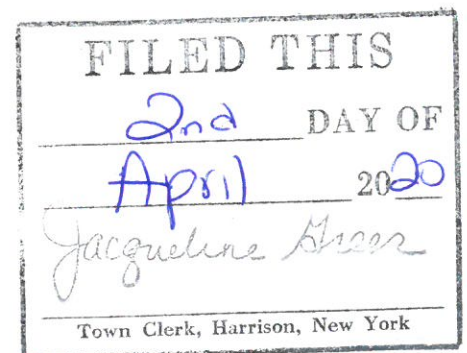
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OLD BUSINESS
