



Comptroller Maureen MacKenzie explained that the 2016 Preliminary Budget proposes a 1.766% tax rate increase. The dollar increase is \$5.88 per thousand dollar assessment. For example, if a house has a value of \$750,000 the monthly dollar increase would be \$5.88. The annual dollar increase on a house assessed at \$750,000 would be around \$70.56. Once again, the Board has come under the State imposed tax cap which this year came to .73%. The town also partnered with Westchester County and other Westchester municipalities and we submitted an Efficiency Plan to New York State. This was done in order to comply with the property tax freeze legislation. This is something in addition to the tax cap. We were just notified that the plan was approved by the State so therefore all tax payers within Harrison, who are STAR eligible, will receive a check from the State for any increase in taxes that they receive for tax years 2015 and 2016. So if your increase was \$70.56 for the Town you will get a check back from the State for that amount.

Supervisor Belmont asked if you are STAR eligible it means a zero percent tax increase for the years, 2015 and 2016.

Comptroller MacKenzie said we are under the tax cap in the Town and the Village. In the Town we are under the cap by approximately \$8,000 and the Village we are under the cap by approximately \$5,000.

Supervisor Belmont asked if anyone had any comments on this 2016 Preliminary Budget Public Hearing.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard requested clarification. During election debates someone stated that the Town was down 22 positions. I'm having trouble finding that in the budget. It doesn't look like we reduced positions.

Supervisor Belmont said actually if you look at the budget there are two additional positions this year. The 22 positions did not come over night, it was over a period of time, I believe it has been seven years. It was 22 positions in the Department of Public Works but we are down 58 positions total.


