## V - - 2016 - - 065 - - A <u>DISCUSSION WITH THE WESTCHESTER JOINT WATER WORKS</u> <u>ON A RATE INCREASE</u>

David Birdsall, Business Manager with the Westchester Joint Water Works discussed the rates and funding for capital projects. Mr. Birdsall presented the Board with the following handout. He said that New York City had adopted a 1.25% rate increase to be effective July 1, 2016. Due to legal proceedings associated with the increase it has been deferred. The New York City water rate that we are charged with will remain the same until further notice.

Trustee Stout asked when this rate, if approved, would go into effect.


David Birdsall, Business Manager with the Westchester Joint Water Works said the Harrison rate would go into effect with the July meter readings. The document that I gave you gives you some history on what the New York City water rate increases have been over the last 16 years. With regards to the Town of Harrison we have recommend a 2.5% increase.

Trustee Stout asked Mr. Birdsall if the 2.5% water rate increase will cover the debt service payments going forward for the bond but not include any cost for New York City charging more for water.

David Birdsall, Business Manager with the Westchester Joint Water Works replied that the New York City rate has been deferred at this point we don't know if they will institute that retroactively and that is not factored into the number.

Mayor Belmont explained there is some major work being done with the water system. Currently there is approximately \$3.6M to be done this year and another \$3M next year. The Board needs to decide if it wants to do the 2.5% now and do a little bit this year and a little bit next year or leave it at zero.

The Board voted to go with a 2% water rate increase.





A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLES FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IN AND FOR THE VILLAGE OF HARRISON, WESTCHESTER COUNTY, NEW YORK AT A TOTAL MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF \$500,000 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$500,000 BONDS OF SAID VILLAGE TO PAY THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT RESOLVED by the by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Harrison, Westchester County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The following are hereby authorized for the Police Department in and for the Village of Harrison, Westchester County, New York:

- a) The purchase of equipment at a maximum estimated cost of \$343,400, being a class of objects or purposes having a period of probable usefulness of five years pursuant to subdivision 32 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law; and
- b) The purchase of police cars at a maximum estimated cost of \$156,600, being a class of objects or purposes having a period of probable usefulness

of three years pursuant to subdivision 77 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 2. The total maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid objects or purposes is \$500,000, and the plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of \$500,000 bonds of said Village hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, to be allocated in accordance with the Section 1 hereof.

Section 3. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the bonds herein authorized will not exceed five years.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said Village of Harrison, Westchester County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said Village, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Village Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment

dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of such Village. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Village Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said
   Village is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with as the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 9. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the <u>Journal News</u>, the official newspaper of said Village hereby designated for such purpose, together with a notice of the Village Clerk in substantially the form set forth in paragraph a of Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.






