2. Letter from Paul Feiner, Supervisor of the Town of Greenburgh, RE: The Property Tax Proposal. Mr. Feiner stated as follows: If a school, village, town or county government believes that it is in the interests of the community to increase taxes by more than the proposed cap, a mandatory referendum should be held and voters should have the ability to choose between two budgets – the proposed budget that is advocated by elected officials (exceed the cap) and a contingency budget (complying with the cap) containing significant program and service cuts. This would provide the public with the opportunity to decide how much or how little government they want and can afford.
- Mr. Feiner also stated that he believes that any tax cap budget requirement should INCLUDE THE STATE of NEW YORK in it. If local governments have to comply with laws that limit the ability to tax, the state should not be exempt. What is good for one level of government should be applied to all.
3. Invitation by Pastor of St. Anthony of Padua Church Rev. Christopher Monturo, to their fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) Annual Blue Mass on Friday, May 13, 2011 at 7:30 pm at St. Anthony's. This year they are honoring the West Harrison Fire Department on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its founding. D. PERSONNEL:

1. Request by Chief of Police Anthony Marraccini for approval for Lt. Michael Olsey to attend the 2011 Spring Semester at Ashford University at a total cost of \$2,749 for the following courses:

“Juvenile Justice and Criminal Law & Procedure”

**Further** that upon satisfactory completion and submission of Lt. Olsey’s attendance, the Comptroller be authorized to audit and pay expenses outlined as per the contract with the HPA. This is a contractual item.

2. Request by Chief Marraccini for approval for four (4) members of the Police Department to attend a Child Passenger Safety Technician Course on May 4<sup>th</sup> through May 7, 2011 at the Greenburgh Town Hall, between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm. The training fee is \$100 per person (total cost \$400.)

3. Notification by Chief Marraccini that the Police Department conducted an AHA CPR/FA/OSHA Bloodbourne Training at the Harrison Volunteer Ambulance Corps, during the month of April on various days for a total of 42 hours. The instructor’s fee is \$55 per hour, total cost is \$2,310. This is a budgeted item.

4. Request by Comptroller Maureen MacKenzie for approval for Purchasing Clerk Marie Bailey to attend the State Purchasing Forum Contractor Trade Show, May 18 and 19, 2011, at the Empire State Plaza, Albany, New York. The only expense to the Town will be meals and mileage to and from the Forum. Funding is available in Travel and Conference Account #001-1345-100-0406. There is no hotel fee.

Payment by the County not to exceed \$8,400. **Further** requested to authorize the Supervisor to execute same.

4. Request by Rev. - use the Town’s electric cart.

- the Large cherry picker. This equipment is needed for the volunteer electricians to insure proper lighting for visitors as well as the safety of the workers.
- to hold a procession through the streets of West Harrison, beginning at 11:15 AM, starting at the Church.
- to change Gainsborg Avenue to a one-way street during Festa hours. This allows for better traffic control and parking.

**Further requested** that the fee be waived.
