

Councilman Malfitano suggested that, since the Board members asked for information which they had yet to receive that the issue be tabled until the next meeting. By then the Board would have the information requested and at that point there could be a discussion and the Board could continue the hearing and make a decision.

Councilman Cannella said the Board may want to extend the hearing to the June 19th meeting. If the information is not received for some reason, we are making people continue to come to the meeting for no reason.

Councilman Mafitano preferred to get this addressed and dealt with. If the Board could accomplish this in two weeks he would prefer to do it then. He suggested the Board should focus on getting this addressed and resolved.

Village Attorney Kraut said to keep in mind the following; one of the changes that the Board asked for was made, making the law inclusive of single family properties. That being a more restrictive change to the law, it would require being republished prior to taking any action and prior to closing any public hearing. If the Board made it less restrictive it would not have to be republished. We are holding republication pending any further changes. By doing so we would eliminate going through the expense of republishing twice. If the Board makes any further formal changes to this, then we will advertise it.

Councilman Malfitano said I suppose anything can happen, on the one hand, on the other hand, I have zero interest in extending this to include single family homeownership.

Village Attorney Kraut said once the Board has a consensus then we either will, or won't, republish it. His suggestion simply was that whatever the Board decides, you're going to need more time.

Councilman Malfitano said then we will take Councilman Cannella's recommendation and keep the Public Hearing open until the June 19th meeting.

Councilman Cannella said the suggestion was made to the Board and he thought the concept, if we were going to go forward with this, was for single family homes that were not owner occupied.

Village Attorney Kraut said that there was some debate on the subject, and he wasn't sure if there was a consensus. Some of the emails he received tended to indicate otherwise. If board extends the hearing until June 19th, you can make any changes. Harrison resident Glen Dahar addressed the Mayor stating that at the last meeting he said that our wells are above the quarry line. I did some checking and they are not. It is still a concern for us in regards to contamination.

Supervisor Belmont said your wells are not above the quarry line but he believed they are above the Mamaroneck River basin

Harrison resident Glen Dahar said we don't know which way the water runs underground. This is still a concern of ours along with all the dust.

Supervisor Belmont declined to discuss this situation. It is taking its due course right now.

Harrison resident Jimmi Pritchard said she understood that when you say this is taking due course but the course has been thrown off base. Twice now it has been delayed in court because Mr. Baraggo didn't have his lawyer there. The Board is not making progress, the residents are being held hostage. This Board or the courts need to do something about this. This continues at the expense and health and well being of Harrison citizens. The process has been to slow.

Harrison resident Joseph Surace said he came here tonight to find out what is going on with the quarry. He heard it was postponed today.

Village Attorney Kraut said he would address it. He knows Ms. Pritchard made mention that it was adjourned twice. That is not the way it went from a procedural standpoint. The first time it was on in court the attorney duly filed an affirmation of actual engagement in trial. There are rules that the courts have to follow in regards to that. The local court judge was confined to accepting that actual engagement as cause to not hear the matter at all. Today it was on procedurally for all purposes. The defendant did appear in court producing a letter that was sent by his attorney to the law department indicating that he had a prior deposition. Attorney Kraut's view was that it was not sufficient to get you out from needing to appear. Moreover; the communication should have been sent to the court seeking permission to not show for court. Nevertheless the local court judge was confined to having a defendant that had council of record, who was not present in the court room, and therefore the judge admonished the defendant. The attorney will be receiving a communication from the court and the town attorney's office reminding him of his responsibilities to appear in court.

Harrison resident Joseph Surace said so we don't have a date yet?

Village Attorney Kraut said the date is June 12th.

2014 - - 212 <u>OLD BUSINESS</u> LUIGI FUNICELLO RESIDENT OF PINEHURST DRIVE

Harrison resident Lugi Funicello, of Pinehurst Drive, Purchase, said he was having a problem with Century Country Club. He submitted pictures to the Board. He was concerned that trees from the Club were falling down onto his property. He stated "I want to be on record that these trees are dangerous and need to come down. I'm concerned about my property and house."

Supervisor Belmont said just so everyone understands, your property backs up to Century Country Club and there is about a 50 foot wooded buffer between your house and the golf course.

Harrison resident Lugi Funicello said there is an easement that belongs to the Town. I have a 15 inch pipe that picks up all the water from the Country Club and goes into the Mamaroneck River. He wanted to be on record saying that Century Country Club needs to do something about these trees.

Supervisor Belmont said that Century Country Club was very receptive to cleaning up in the wooded buffer area.

Harrison resident Lugi Funicello said they cleaned up some but we are going to have a problem. He is trying to be a good neighbor.

I have another problem. I live in a subdivision where all the wires are underground. When Councilman Malfitano was the Mayor Con Edison put up polls in front of my house. This happened in 2001.

Councilman Malfitano said to correct the record, this happened before I was Mayor. You came to us to try and seek some relief to get Con Edison to remove the polls. We were not able to do that; we went through the process.

Harrison resident Lugi Funicello said now you have Verizon and Con Edison putting up cables. They belong underneath the ground. This is not fair. I'm a taxpayer. I thank you for your time.
