

AUTHORIZATION FOR THE SUPERVISOR TO SIGN THE ENVIRONMENTAL EASEMENT BETWEEN NEW YORK STATE AND THE TOWN OF HARRISON FOR THE BEAVER SWAMP BROOK PROJECT

Harrison resident Mike LaDore asked the Board what the easement is for.

Deputy Village Attorney Cipolla said it is an environmental easement with the NYS Environmental Conservation that restricts the future use of the location. The intended purpose is recreational and restricts what it could turn to in the future.

Harrison resident Mike LaDore said the intended use for the Town is for a recreational facility. For five years we have been in DEC hearings. You are on hold. We don't know if it will be a recreational facility.

Village Attorney Kraut said that is incorrect. What you are getting to is whether it would be a passive recreational facility or an active one. Whether it would include sports fields or scenic public open space, but in either event, in terms of environmental easement or covenant on the property, it is to make sure that it can't be used in a matter that is inconsistent with recreation; the Town couldn't put an office building there.

Harrison resident Mike LaDore said that what I am getting at is that we are in DEC hearings. We have been waiting for a year for the Commissioner to make a decision on whether or not Harrison can go forward, whether it is a ball field, a passive park, or whether fill has to be removed to reduce flooding in the area. What I'm concerned about is that you are making a decision and you are entering into an agreement with the DEC when nothing has been resolved yet. Don't you think we have to wait until the Commissioner makes a decision? The Judge already made his ruling; we are on appeal, with no monetary value, just for the record. Don't you think that you should not be entering into any agreements with the DEC until the Commissioner makes a ruling because if you have easements there and you don't know if any of these easements are going to affect any of the property owners that are surrounding this area?

Town Attorney Allegretti said this is mandated by the DEC and something that should have been done many years ago and was lost in paperwork in the previous Mayor's office and it just resurfaced in the past six months. Mr. Cipolla and I have been working diligently with the DEC staff to get this done, getting all the parcels that are identified as being in the area, included as part of the conservation easement; we can't delay on this.

Harrison resident Mike LaDore said that there are people in that area, whether Harrison or Rye, all of a sudden after five years of litigation and not for monetary value but to protect our properties, the Town Board comes up with a resolution for easements. No decisions have been made by the Commissioner of the DEC and even when that decision is made, as residents, we will take the next action. You are jumping the gun as far as I'm concerned; voting on something regarding that parcel of land until a final decision has been made.

2012 - - 302 (continued)

Councilman Malfitano said the Grantor of this easement is the Town/Village of Harrison, we own the property. The State is requesting as the Grantee that we provide them with an easement. That is what the State is requesting. The purpose is, to provide, according to the State of New York and the Department of Environmental Protection, in order to ensure the protection of the public health and the environment. Essentially what the Town is doing is acknowledging that the purposes of the easement are to convey to the Grantee (the State) real property rights and interests that will run with the land in perpetuity. It is not the Town doing anything. It is the State requesting that the Town comply to grant the State of New York for the benefit of public health, an easement that allows them to do certain things. It has nothing to do with the future use, however that may be determined, whether passive or active, it has to do with granting an easement by the owner of the property to the State at the State's request.

Village Attorney Kraut said the environmental easement is a required piece to these types of remediation projects so you need to roll the clock back, four Mayor's ago, when this all started, and this was a remediation project for which the town received funds. Part of the way the remediation was funded requires this document. What the document says is in order to establish environmental easements you have to have an enforceable means of insuring the performance operation maintenance and monitoring requirements and the restriction of future uses of the land. As part of the clean up that the DEC did it requires that there be the ability that the DEC actually has a right to come on and enforce testing to ensure that that environmental control still takes place. There is a site management plan that requires varies future testing, etc. of a site. What the document prohibits, this is the right we are giving away, we own the property, and when you grant an easement or you put a restriction on your property, you're giving away a little slice of your bundle of rights as a property owner. It says that the control property shall not be used for residential or restricted residential purposes. It is basically saying that you can't build residences there, you can't use it for restrictive residential purposes and the reason for that is that they don't want the risk of passage exposure to folks living in residences on the property.

Councilman Cannella said that he wanted to make a comment. Environment easements are restrictive not expansive so any restriction that the town places on use of the property gives the grantee the right to enforce the easement. It is restrictive and protective. This is a favorable thing to execute rather than a negative one.

Harrison resident Mike LaDore asked the Board if their decision today was so the town could get whatever money is in the fund that the DEC owes them. Is it to get that \$100,000 back; to put in our coffers?

Councilman Cannella said that is not the motivation for the easement. The easement is a restriction on the town's use of the property which we all agreed would be a restriction from the very beginning.

Harrison resident Mike LaDore said he would just ask that the Town Board wait until the Commissioner makes a ruling.

Harrison resident Lucille Held asked what the consequence would be if you don't pass this tonight.

Village Attorney Kraut said that not signing it puts funds already received and expended at risk.

Councilman Malfitano asked for the record, could you, in round dollars, quantify what those dollars happen to be.

Comptroller MacKenzie said about 5.2 million dollars.

Harrison resident Jimmi Pritchard asked does this mean that we will move ahead with the concepts and the activities that were planned when this was going to become a ball field.

Village Attorney Kraut said the ultimate outcome of the DEC Proceeding and the ultimate use of the property and the execution of the environmental easement run apart from one another.

Harrison resident Jimmi Pritchard said she wanted to go on record as to saying that she doesn't want to do anything that will create or lead toward more flooding for the people that live in that area. That would be absolutely unethical for this Board to do.

Harrison resident Dave Cristiano said I am here because I don't quite understand the easement in regards to my property line. I own a piece of real estate there. To me the word easement means going through a piece of real estate that a person doesn't own. Now that you went over the easement I understand it. My second question is will the easement have any effect on future changing of zoning laws for building there. It doesn't restrict me from doing something to my property?

Councilman Cannella responded that it does not affect your property. You are not signing it. Councilman Cannella said there is absolutely no down side to this no matter what your views are of the ultimate use of the property. It is a restriction, not an expansion.


