## 2015 - - 061 <u>UPDATE ON THE FEMA COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM</u> <u>BY TOWN ENGINEER MICHAEL AMODEO</u>

Town Engineer Michael Amodeo addressed the Board with regard to the Town's participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). The Town's involvement is by adhering to a certain set of rules and regulations that were passed down from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). It is the Town's responsibility to regulate these laws and enforce them. The NFIP has instituted a community rating system. The program provides benefits for communities that go above and beyond the standard rules and regulations set by FEMA. Over the last couple of years my office has been working to get ourselves into this program which has different categories that the town is required to excel in. The NFIP, in correlation with FEMA, visits our community and rates us. Depending on our rating, they provide some benefits. Some of the categories that we have to excel in are public outreach and education, mapping, regulations, damage reduction and preparedness. For the last couple of years we have been working towards these goals. Mr. Amodeo has taken the required courses and has been nationally certified as a Flood Plan Manager. NFIP and the State came in and audited the Town. As of October 2014 we were given a rating of 8. The ratings go from 10 to 1. We received a grade of 8 meaning that from October 2014 all of our community members that have flood insurance get a 10% discount in their policy premium for their flood insurance.

Supervisor Belmont and the Town Board members thanked Town Engineer Mike Amodeo for all of his efforts and hard work.

## 2015 - - 071 - - a <u>AUTHORIZATION TO FILE A JOINT EFFICIENCY PLAN</u> <u>WITH THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER</u>

Comptroller MacKenzie read a memo she wrote to the Board in an attempt to explain the Local Government Efficiency Program.

As you are aware, the Property Tax Cap Legislation took effect for budget years beginning in 2012. For the budget years 2012, 2013 and 2014 we came in under the required tax cap.

Beginning with the 2015 budget year there are some additional requirements and enhancements to the legislation. In addition to coming in under the tax cap for 2015, (which we did) by January 21, 2015 I had to formally certify to the Comptroller's Office that we came in under the tax cap. By doing this, Harrison residents who are STAR eligible will receive a tax freeze credit check. The calculation for the amount of this check will be performed by NYS Tax and Finance. They will issue and mail the checks. Our eligible residents will receive a check equal to their Harrison Town Tax increase for 2015.

So, what is STAR eligible? The taxpayer's primary residence must have qualified for the STAR exemption. It must have been owner occupied, the primary residences, where the resident owners and their spouse's income is less than \$500,000. That is what makes you STAR eligible.

In order for our residents to be able to receive the tax freeze credit check for budget years 2016 and 2017, in addition to Harrison coming in under the tax cap and certifying as such, we will also have to develop an efficiency plan that would identify past, present and/or future shared services, cooperation agreements, mergers and/or efficiencies that have been, or will be implemented by us to achieve savings either individually or in the aggregate. The savings to be achieved is as follows: in 2017, 2018 and 2019 we would have to save 1% of the 2014 Town of Harrison Tax Levy, so for us it is approximately \$500,000.

The look-back period for our municipality with regard to eligible efficiencies commences on the first day of our 2012 fiscal year, which was January 1, 2012.

The County will be proving us with excel templates and consequent sheets that will save us all a great deal of time and effort. They will also be responsible for the submission of the final product to the state on our behalf. There is no charge for this service by the County.

#### 2015 - - 072 OLD BUSINESS

Harrison resident Rob Porto addressed the Board. Mr. Porto said we lost services with our garbage collection; so our taxes only went up a little bit but we did lose services.

Supervisor Belmont asked Mr. Porto when this was done?

Harrison resident Rob Porto said it was done a long time ago when Joan Walsh was in office. This Board should have repealed it. I see that in the beginning of the meeting we had a lot of promotions; I congratulate those people. I see you hired three police officers. I'm sure this is to be more efficient.

Councilman Cannella said these were positions that were in the budget that were open.

Harrison resident Rob Porto said he wanted to make clear that the Town is hiring three new police officers. I'm asking you not to target the residents, in a sense, to pay for more police. We want fair, we don't want to feel like targets. I know the traffic cameras and plate readers are coming.

Police Chief Marraccini said that is a crazy statement to make that the Town of Harrison residents are going to be targets. I feel these words are not even comprehensible.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard addressed the Board regarding the Lake Street Quarry. In a previous meeting it was mentioned several times that the matter was adjudicated; the agreement between the town and the lawyers working with the quarry. What does that mean?

Town Attorney Allegretti said he didn't know who used the term adjudicated.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said that Councilman Malfitano did five times.

Town Attorney Allegretti said a settlement was reached is what that means. It has been made public.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said if it was actually adjudicated, were there legal issues involved? Usually adjudicated means that it goes before a court and settled. It is my understanding that this did not go before a court, it did originally but in 2013 the Appeals Court said for it to be sent back to White Plains because the Judge had made the wrong decision. I have a copy of that paperwork.

Town Attorney Allegretti said there are legal issues in every lawsuit. The Appellate Court upheld the Judge. The bottom line is, it was settled. There was not a court order or decision that came down. The parties reached a settlement.

#### 2015 - - 072 (continued)

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said there were issues for some of the parties involved that were not concerned in this agreement. You said it was worth about \$825,000 in potential fines that we did not collect. One of the reasons that we didn't want to collect these fines was because it might involve a lawsuit or more legal fees because Mr. Barrago might sue the town and we might have to pay more legal fees to settle it. If we would have followed through and fined Mr. Barrago and collected those fines it would have been worth \$125 per taxpayer in Harrison.

Town Attorney Allegretti said you are talking about maximum potential fines on code prosecutions that if each and every charge was sustained that that would have been a potential fine coming out of the local court here. That is not typically how judges make decisions. They don't usually max fines out on every single charge that's levied and proven against a co-defendant. The town has made a decision that entering into a global settlement on the property was better than continuing litigation on many different fronts including here in local court, including at the Supreme Court level, including the Appellate Division, and ultimately at the Court of Appeals of New York State. With that backdrop, if you are going to say what the settlement is, you may as well say what all the salient terms are. Right now we have had a stop work order in effect for five years. There has been no activity on site. There are significant benefits to this agreement that I think you are leaving out of the discussion. The Town made a decision that it was in the best interest of all parties to resolve this. The settlement allows Mr. Baraggo or his third party designee to come in and make an application for a different use of the property. There is going to be a new use on the property, if, as it goes through the channels, the Planning Board accepts the site plan and the text amendments that they are going to be proposing and that is all part of the settlement agreement.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said I am concerned about the quality of life for the residents of West Harrison. I would like to be able to think that this town would require Mr. Baraggo make that area clean again.

Town Attorney Allegretti said that is the goal of the settlement. If you look at the settlement it says that he has to apply for an Assisted Living Facility. That is one use that we have authorized him to apply for, or his designee, and if that doesn't get approved he has to come back to the Town Board and asked for a second or third success of use; he can't change his mind at the Planning Board and go with a different use. This is the only use he is authorized to go before the Planning Board with.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said I'm not sure, and I'm not speaking for all the residents over there, that all are happy with the idea of Assisted Living, which is so many units, that it would be like a four story huge building with parking and traffic. There are issues with the property across the street because he dumped asphalt in the wetlands. That should be cleaned up.

Town Attorney Allegretti said that is all being addressed.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said this is all problematic for me because we are telling the Planning Board what he is coming in with and that you better do it.

Councilman Malfitano said absolutely not. We have covered that issue on numerous occasions as it has been raised in several previous Board meetings.

Harrison resident Elizabeth Pritchard said that if Mr. Baraggo does what we asked him to do and we told him what we wanted him to do but if the Planning Board would say no to him he is off scot-free and he never has to pay anything.

Supervisor Belmont said you and others have asked this question numerous times. It has been addressed; if it gets rejected by the Planning Board now he can come to the Town Board and ask for another use. He is not off scot-free.
