AUTHORIZATION OF A BOND RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING, SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM, THE PREPARATION OF A MAP, PLAN AND REPORT FOR THE PROPOSED EXTENSION OF THE PILGRIM ROAD DRAINAGE DISTRICT, IN AND FOR THE VILLAGE OF HARRISON, WESTCHESTER COUNTY, NEW YORK, AT A MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF \$100,000 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$100,000 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID VILLAGE TO PAY THE COST THEREOF.

On motion of Mayor Belmont, seconded by Trustee Cannella,

it was

RESOLVED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Harrison, Westchester County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The preparation of a map, plan and report for the proposed extension of the Pilgrim Road Drainage District, in and for the Village of Harrison, Westchester County, New York, including incidental costs and expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized, **SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM**, at a maximum estimated cost of \$100,000.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of the aforesaid maximum estimated cost is by the issuance of \$100,000 serial bonds of said Village, hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is five years, pursuant to subdivision 48 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the serial bonds herein authorized will exceed not five years.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said Village of Harrison, Westchester County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said Village, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Village Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the serial bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue serial bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of such Village. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Village Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Village is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 9. Upon this resolution taking effect, the same shall be published in summary form in the <u>Journal News</u>, which is hereby designated as the official newspaper of said Village for such purpose, together with a notice of the Village Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 10. THIS RESOLUTION IS ADOPTED SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM PURSUANT TO SECTION 209-b OF THE TOWN LAW.

TABLED: REQUEST BY COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS ANTHONY ROBINSON FOR APPROVAL FOR THE REVISED 2012-2013 CAPITAL BUDGET

Commissioner of Public Works Anthony Robinson commented on the 2012 DPW Capital Budget. He stated that it has come to light, over the past several days, that some of the Board members had some questions on several items contained in the capital budget which would require going into some detail, with backup material, and require some input from the town engineer. That being the case I don't think this is the forum for the discussion and I would request that this be tabled until the next meeting.

Harrison Resident Lucille Held said she wanted to make a comment on the side loader garbage truck that the town was thinking about ordering at a cost of \$350,000. The thing that perturbs me is that we bond things and we don't give the complete and total price of what an item actually costs, because we ignore the bonding. Every time we bond, the face value of the bond, is exceeded with 50% more dollars to set the bond out, to propose it, to advertise it, etc. The machine (side loader) costs \$350,000, the bond would be \$175,000, and the answer I receive when I ask "tell me exactly what it will cost", is well you won't be there for the thirty year bond to go up, so you are only going to pay part of it. I'm living here 56 years so I'm in for almost three twenty year bonds and I'm in for almost two thirty year bonds. So I have already paid, in my million dollar tax addition, for all of the bonds that came due in my time level. I have a problem with the fact that you were going to supply us with the garbage bins. We don't know if we are going to get one recycling and one regular bin. The statement made was that the town is going to pay for them. Well paying for one 64 gallon bin is \$55,000. We have 6,900 parcels that pay taxes to the town. If we cut the amount of parcels in half, giving only bins to half the residents, it will be \$165,000 for them and would be bonded at \$82,000. We don't want to get involved in any more bonding and anymore owing money.

Harrison Resident Rob Porto said he thinks Harrison looks like garbage and he thinks that was the ruination of Harrison when the garbage was not picked up in the back homes. I'm speaking the truth, this town looks like garbage.

Mayor Belmont took umbrage to Mr. Porto's comment and chastised him for not being positive. Mr. Belmont commented on the garbage truck. He stated that the truck itself was approximately \$300,000 or less that was a budgeted amount and the \$50,000 was included for pails. This vehicle is not going to pick up all 6,000 homes. Ljust want to have this out there for the record.

The matter was tabled until the April 19, 2012 Meeting.

APPROVAL TO PROVIDE DESIGNATED PARKING SPOTS FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES EFFECTIVE MARCH 19, 2012

Harrison resident, Robert Porto said that is there any way we could put these vehicles behind the buildings in the commuter lot off Calvert Street? Mayor Belmont confirmed that it is behind the Fleet Building. Mr. Porto stated that this parking issue seems to be like a money making thing.

Harrison resident, Lucille Held asked Mayor Belmont what happens if they don't get out of the lot by 7:00 a.m. Also do we have to widen the size of the spaces for trucks? Mayor Belmont replied no to this question.

Councilman Cannella asked what is the amount of parking spots?

Mayor Belmont replied maximum twenty (20).

Town Attorney Allegretti asked if the resolution was going to include that these vehicles must be registered to a Harrison address and be for Harrison residents only. Mayor Belmont replied yes. They do have to sign an Indemnification Agreement.

Councilman Malfitano asked what is the penalty for parking beyond the limit? Is it a ticket? You also need the right to tow. You have those spots sold to residents that are permitted to park there during the day.

Councilman Cannella agreed that you need the right to tow. You have to have the right to remove the vehicle if it is not moved. With those qualifications I'll make the motion.

On motion of Trustee Cannella, seconded by Trustee Amelio,

it was

RESOLVED that, beginning Monday, March 19, 2012, the Town/Village of Harrison will provide designated parking spaces for *twenty (20)* commercial vehicles, in the west bound commuter parking lot adjacent to Calvert Street from 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM daily, including weekends and holidays.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the fee will be \$150 per commercial vehicle, per month. Payment is due in cash or check payable at the Harrison Town Clerk's Office.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the commercial vehicle along with the driver's license *must* be registered to the Harrison address.

FURTHER RESOLVED that an Indemnification Agreement be signed.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town/Village of Harrison has the right to tow.

FURTHER RESOLVED to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Law Department, the Treasurer and the Chief of Police.
