Mayor Belmont explained that the Board is considering adding commercial parking spaces in the downtown commuter lot. Mayor Belmont stated we are close to having that done. I am working with another agency to try and get some off street parking in the West Harrison area as well. We will have more information on this at our next meeting. If anyone has an interest in off-street commercial parking they should contact the Clerk's office.

Trustee Malfitano suggested that by the next meeting the Board should be prepared to resolve the issue, and the thought process is that overnight parking of commercial vehicles will be provided for in a segment of the downtown Harrison train station.
