Town resident Lucille Held spoke with regard to the recent Amendment to Chapter 38 of the Vehicles and Traffic Section of the Village Code. She stated that she took a ride down Congress Street yesterday and it is a lovely street. She noticed there were a lot of empty spaces, but then realized that it was during the day and people had their cars out, so she went back later in the evening. Cars were parked nicely. She could not identify what the reason of the commercial situation came about in that area. Of course I did not go to West Harrison, so I can't attest to the fact that yes it is, or no, it isn't. She thinks we need to analyze actually what was done to those people in that area. What really is the quality of life? In every area in the town of Harrison there is someone who is going to come up to this board and say "Look here you have diminished my quality of life and I want you to fix it." In the Town of Harrison Code book there is a definition of livability. We have in the Code Book many instances quoted health, welfare and security. If that is what health, welfare and security is then livability is also having money to feed your family; food, clothing and shelter would fall under livability. She doesn't feel that what was done to these people in as far as commercial is a fair thing to have done.

Trustee Amelio asked Mrs. Held if she was aware that this is already under consideration.

Town resident John Katsogridakis asked what is done in Rye, Larchmont or Scarsdale? He further stated that there is a homeowner on Winfield that owns more than 20 acres of property. Across from that property, there is a man who is operating a business and parking the cars on his street and his property. Why does the town of Harrison allow this?

Town resident Robert Porto expressed his opinion by stating it is a matter of limits. If you are running a business out of your home that is wrong, and if you are parking excessively on the street, that is wrong. He thinks you should have a heart. These are craftsman. These are the people who make up downtown. If you listen to that law the first fifteen seconds says it all to me. That law is a disgrace as written.
